

#### Changes to the way we lived

I had another birthday a few weeks ago and it made me think of the changed as to how we live these days compared to when I was a boy. I was born in the cottage next to the Bull and Butcher which in those days was one of a pair of cottages. My first memory is of going across the square with my mother to the village pump to collect a bucket of water this was the water supply for the cottage. Lighting was by oil lamps and candles and the toilet was a smelly bucket type in a hut down the garden.

In about 1938 we moved into a new four bedroomed council house nowadays called

Coronation Cottages. We now had running water although my father had to pump the water with a semi rotary pump on the kitchen wall from a well in a neighbour's garden to a tank in our roof. We now had an indoor flush toilet and electric lights on a shilling metre but there were no power points although at the time it wasn't really a problem as we had no appliances



to put into a socket. Our radio at that time was battery powered by a glass accumulator that had to be charged up every week, one big dry battery and one smaller dry battery. Ironing was done with flat irons heated in front of the coal fired black lead grate, which was where the cooking and baking was done. To boil the kettle first thing in the morning before the fire got going we had a small two burner paraffin stove. We now had a bathroom that just contained a bath

and a cold water tap, there was no wash basin. Hot water for the bath had to be heated up in the brick built copper in the kitchen and carried to the bathroom in a bucket. The copper in the kitchen was where the washing was boiled and then put through a wooden rollered mangle to squeeze the water out which very often broke buttons on the garments. Years later my father paid privately to have electric sockets installed, an electric cooker, an electric Sadia to heat the water in the kitchen and a large one in the bathroom. He also had a wash basin fitted in the bathroom.

# What's been happening at St. James and St. John Church of England Primary School...

St. James and St. John School is a one-form entry school located in two villages. Foundation Stage, Year 1 and Year 2 children are taught at the infant site in Akeley and Year 3 up to Year 6 are taught at the junior site in Chackmore.

June has arrived and with it a further step into the new 'normal' with continued relaxations of the Coronavirus restrictions. Here at St. James and St. John, this easing of the guidelines has led to some very exciting news for the children- the possibility of a school trip to mark the end of the year! Each year has a different trip planned, linked to the topics they have been learning about. At the time of writing, the children had not yet been told where they were going, so unfortunately we cannot reveal those yet!

In the meantime, the children are enthusiastically engaging in their learning for this term. Alongside their Maths and English lessons, there are a wide range of topics being studied as part of our full and varied curriculum – these include explorers, plants, castles, weather, electricity, habitats, forces and the Victorians! We are hoping to be able to hold in-person 'Parent Consultation' appointments later in the term, where parents will be able to see the children's fantastic learning for themselves.

We were very lucky at the Akeley site to have the one sunny day, in a week of rain, for the annual May Day celebrations. Our May King and Queen started the proceedings, with the help of their attendants. Each class performed a dance and then all three classes joined together for a rather large version of 'In and Out the Dusty Bluebells'. Although parents were unable to be present due to the guidelines at the time, there were numerous photos taken, which were posted on the school's website and Facebook page.

The year 6 'Charity Representatives' were hard at work in May, as they encouraged everyone to come to school in their pyjamas in return for a small donation for 'PyjamaRama' day. We were proud to be raising money for the Booktrust charity, which supports children who are less fortunate to share the warming experience of a bedtime story and help families engage with reading.

Our 'Parent Voice' meetings are continuing to engage parents remotely and have become a great channel for parents to ask questions and make comments. We thank all the parents for engaging so well with this and making it such a positive and successful tool.

Looking forward to September, and we are excited to meet the children and parents of our Foundation 2021/22 class. We have been able to offer these families a tour of the school, something we were unable to do earlier in the year due to Covid-19 restrictions. We are also able to offer an inperson welcome meeting, as well as stay-and-play sessions for our new starters in July to help ease them through this transition.

Transitions mornings are also going ahead for all our classes as normal this year, including for our newest intake. All the teachers look forward to getting to know their new class, although there is still a while to go and a lot of learning to be done, before the end of the School Year!
