

PAKELEY PARISH COUNCIL

In 2006 Akeley Parish Council commissioned a survey to establish the condition of the 26 street lights in the village. In order to provide for maintenance and repair/replacement of the lights it was agreed that a sum of £600 per annum would be set aside from the precept. Since that time £6,920 has been built up in the reserves.

In 2019 the Parish Council contacted 3 suppliers for quotes to replace the lights. Zeta Specialist Lighting were the chosen contractor. The new lights will give energy and maintenance cost savings. The Parish Council received an interest free loan over 5 years to cover the remainder of the cost of the project.

Due to the length of time taken for the Ministry of Housing Communities and Local Government to approve our borrowing application the project has been delayed until now.

At the time of writing this report 24 of the street lights have been replaced and the 2 that are on concrete columns in Manor Road are scheduled to be replaced by the end of November. There is a delay on these 2 as the concrete posts are also to be replaced.

We re told that the lights will dim to 50% between midnight and 6am.

We would like to thank all past and present Councillors and Clerks for their work on this long-term project.

AKELEY CHARITIES

Subject to funds being available, the Trustees will pay a nominal sum of £50.00 towards dental and optical costs incurred this year by those over 60, being Akeley residents and not in receipt of the annual payment at Christmas. They have asked us to decorate a Christmas tree, which will be standing among others at the entrance to the Gardens. 

Changes in the way we lived 3 (continued)

It must have been just before the war that we went on holiday to my mother's parents in Barnsley. My young Uncle Frank who had won medals for playing football for Barnsley Boys took me as a treat to see Barnsley play. Now the only football I had seen was the village lads kicking a blown up pig's bladder about using two coats on the ground for a goal. At the football match I hadn't a clue what was going on and after the match asked Uncle Frank who had won, he was not impressed. It was soon after the Barnsley holiday that the war started and Uncle Frank joined the RAF where eventually he would become a Squadron Leader.




At the school the village children used the school in the mornings and the evacuees with their teachers, Miss Baldwin and Miss Watson in the afternoons. Eventually all the infants would be moved down to the village Hall with the London teachers and all of the older would use the village school with the teachers Miss

Samson and Miss Neal. We now had to carry gas masks everywhere we went and often would have to sit under the desk wearing the gas mask and I remember I was so pleased I was old enough not to have a Mickey Mouse gas mask.

Life for us boys was getting quite exciting. We had planes flying over and the occasional

plane crash to go and explore, tanks going up and down the road on manoeuvres and bursting through hedges. The A.R.P. practising putting out incendiary bombs in The Square and the Home Guard practising and parading their drill in Akeley Square and also practising throwing grenades in the field called The Close.



Dad came home on leave and had to bring his rifle and five rounds of ammunition with him, mother made him store his rifle behind the piano. One afternoon a week the women of the village would meet at the Rectory to knit socks and scarves etc. to send to Akeley men in the forces. Also Mr Skinner and his committee would organise dances and social evenings to raise money for the troops. My mother being on the committee would send my older sister Pam and I around the village selling raffle tickets to swell the funds. J.W.Tibbetts.
