

### **Akeley Charities: Dental and Optical Costs**

#### **Dental Costs**

Subject to funding being available, and at their discretion, the Trustees will pay a sum of up to £50 towards **dental** costs incurred during a given year.

Only one payment, to assist in dental costs, per person per year can be claimed.

#### **Optical Costs**

Subject to funding being available, and at their discretion, the Trustees will pay a sum of up to £50 towards **optical** costs incurred during a given year.

Only one payment, to assist in optical costs, per person per year can be claimed.

Applicants in receipt of the Christmastime payment may also apply for assistance with optical and dental costs.

- Any relief provided by Akeley Poors Allotment is for the direct benefit of the individual recipient.
- The benefit is for residents who have lived within the Parish of Akeley for a minimum of two complete years (as of 30th September in each year).
- All claimants must be 60 years of age, or over.
- Applications from new claimants must be accompanied by either a copy of their birth certificate or a copy of their passport.
- Any recipient unable to collect in person may appoint a representative. The
  representative must bring written and signed authorisation with them on the day of
  collection.

# What's been happening at St. James and St. John Church of England Primary School...

St. James and St. John School is a one-form entry school located in two villages. Foundation Stage, Year 1 and Year 2 children are taught at the infant site in Akeley and Year 3 up to Year 6 are taught at the junior site in Chackmore.

The summer term is well under way, with lunchtimes on the field not far away.

At the very start of the summer term, the children on the School Council had the honour of representing the school, when they planted some trees on the Chackmore school site with volunteers from the National Trust. We look forward to seeing them grow.

May saw us celebrating the King's Coronation. The whole school came together to take part in Coronation activities. Throughout the day the children had a chance to mix with the other year groups and take part in special themed activities. The weather didn't quite hold long enough for an outside tea party, but with plan B in action each class celebrated with a little tea party inside, followed by games and activities to end the day.

This half term the Year 4s and some Year 3s will set off for three days at Everdon residential centre. We look forward to hearing about their adventures as, for many, they stay away from home and parents for the first time.

Several year groups will have sports festivals during this term, where pupils will attend special sports events to compete (in a friendly manner) against other local schools. We look forward to hearing about how they played, with our usual emphasis on teamwork and good sportsmanship, alongside their achievements.

We look forward to welcoming our 'Marvellous Men' to our special assemblies in the run up to Father's Day, to celebrate the way they support us. We are also looking forward to the annual whole-school Sports Day, which will take place at the end of June at the Chackmore site.



#### Akeley By-pass

I suppose I am one of the few people now that knew we were going to have a By-pass at Akeley. It was to start opposite the Greyhound Inn and the Lace School was demolished and the ground dug out – this is where the cars are now parked either side of Coronation Cottages entrance. I can only remember it as a dug out area which we boys called the



Quarry and on the right hand side it had a ditch in the middle and there was a well worn track across at an angle and up the bank and across the grass verge which was well used by everybody when going down the village which have saved us at least a hundred yards.



On the verge was a well with a windlass and doors over the well and this must have been to serve the Lace Cottages and was still there until at least the end of World War Two. (no health and Safety in those days!) The By-pass was to go behind the village and emerge somewhere around where the old village hall was. I don't know what year the work was started but it must have been in the early 1930's. We moved into number 16 Council Houses (as it used to be called before 1944) in about 1938

and the end two houses were built before the war and I got into trouble for running round the scaffold as a small boy. There was going to be another pair of houses and soil was being dumped at the bottom of the hill to make the ground up but the war stopped that.



For VE Day the boys built a bonfire in the 'quarry' and when it was lit on VE day an airman came across from the Greyhound Inn with a Very Pistol and fired red and green very lights so at least we had some fireworks as fireworks were unobtainable during the war. We also had a bonfire there on VJ Day, again organised by us boys, and for years afterwards a Bonfire was always built there on Bonfire nights.
