23/02063/CPE | Certificate of lawfulness application for existing use for Akeley House Farm in breach of occupancy condition 2 of permission 93/00676/APP

Akeley Parish Council objects to the proposal to lift the agricultural tie on the above property as despite Akeley being a rural farming community there are very few properties with agricultural ties. These ties present people with an opportunity to work within agriculture and forestry whilst living in areas where property prices are high. There are several large properties within Akeley for sale at the moment yet there is very little in terms of affordable housing. 'The site has been used for agricultural related purposes during the current owners' time there, including the breeding of horses and keeping of hens. There is also a history of planning applications for the site made by the occupants which relate to and specify the agricultural use of the land, the latest of which was only made in 2018. The current property and land provides a rare and excellent opportunity for someone wishing to develop an agricultural business. It would be a shame to see this opportunity taken away from any future occupiers. Therefore Akeley Parish Council objects to the agricultural tie being removed
